Terms and Conditions of Use

By connecting to East Boldre Village Hall Free WiFi service, you agree to comply with the following Terms and Conditions of Use.

- 1. The East Boldre Village Hall Free WiFi service (the Service) is for the sole use of persons hiring or attending events at the hall. It is not a public WiFi service.
- 2. You must access the Service WiFi using the login information and password given to you. You must not attempt to access any other part of the Service including but not limited to the Service's modem, cloud services, connected devices and administration system.
- 3. The login password will be changed from time to time.
- 4. Children using the Service must be adequately supervised by their parent/guardian or responsible adult.
- 5. The Service must be switched off by the last hirer to leave the hall unless otherwise instructed.
- 6. The Service must not knowingly be used for unacceptable activities which includes but is not limited to the following activities:
 - a. Using excessive bandwidth to download or upload large files for personal use which is unrelated to the activities for which the hall was hired.
 - b. Using the Service in such a way that degrades the service to other subscribers and/or other hall users.
 - c. Using the Service in such a way to cause annoyance, inconvenience or needless anxiety to other persons using the hall.
 - d. Connection to the Service via computers, phones, tablets or other devices which are not protected by suitable anti-virus software and firewall to prevent the Service from infection by viruses, Trojans or other malware.
 - e. Connection via computers, phones, tablets or other devices which are infected with viruses, Trojans or other malware.
 - f. To send or procure the sending of any unsolicited advertising or promotional material such as but not limited to, spam.
- 7. The Service must not be used in an unlawful manner, in contravention of any applicable legislation or license which includes but is not limited to the following activities:
 - a. For fraudulent purposes or in connection with any criminal offence.
 - b. For transmission of any data which is prohibited, illegal or contrary to international public order, such as, but not limited to, pornography, paedophilia, racist/religious hate-crime, fascist and/or terrorist related information.
 - c. For hacking or any attempt to illegally use, manipulate, or appropriate data or information via the Internet, including, but not limited to, breaking security of any online systems, such as, without limitation, e-commerce Internet sites, financial institutions, and any other activity prohibited by law.
 - d. To send, knowingly receive, upload, download, distribute, share, use or re-use any material which is abusive, indecent, defamatory, obscene or menacing (specifically including via P2P file sharing protocols, such as BitTorrent for example).

- e. To send, knowingly receive, upload, download, distribute, share, use or re-use any material which is in breach of copyright, confidence, privacy or any other rights (specifically including via P2P file sharing protocols, such as BitTorrent for example);
- f. To send knowingly any material which contains software viruses or any computer code, files or programmes designed to interrupt, damage or destroy or limit the functionality of any computer software, hardware or telecommunications equipment;
- g. As these premises are not covered by a TV Licence, it is a criminal offence for anyone here to watch or record live TV programmes on any channel or device, or to download or watch BBC programmes on iPlayer, without being covered by a licence. If you break the law, you risk prosecution and a fine. The maximum penalty is a £1,000 fine plus any legal costs and/or compensation you may be ordered to pay. You may watch live TV or BBC programmes on iPlayer here on your own devices only, provided your device is powered by internal batteries and is not plugged in, and you have a current TV Licence at your home address.
- 8. You must not use the Service in any way which results in the inclusion of our Internet Service Provider's servers or networks on Internet blacklists whether knowingly or unknowingly.
- 9. You agree to indemnify the Trustees of East Boldre Village Hall against any financial claim made against them or any financial loss resulting from suspension of service or legal proceedings that are brought or threatened against the Trustees resulting from your misuse of the Service.
- 10. Our Internet Service Provider and the Trustees of East Boldre Village Hall reserve the right to monitor data usage and to block access to dangerous, malicious and inappropriate websites. Save for the purposes of network diagnostics we do not examine the use to which you put the Service or the nature of the information you send or receive.
- 11. If you knowingly or unknowingly use the Service to engage in any activity which constitutes or is capable of constituting a criminal offence, either in the United Kingdom or in any state throughout the world:
 - a. You agree and acknowledge that we (the Trustees of East Boldre Village Hall) may be required to provide assistance and information to law enforcement, governmental agencies and other authorities.
 - b. You agree and acknowledge that we may keep a log of the Internet Protocol ("IP") addresses of any devices which access the Service, the times when they have accessed the Service and the activity associated with that IP address.
 - c. You further agree we are entitled to co-operate with law enforcement authorities and rights-holders in the investigation of any suspected or alleged illegal activity by you which may include, but is not limited to, disclosure of such information as we have (whether pursuant to clause 11b or otherwise), and are entitled to provide by law, to law enforcement authorities or rights-holders.

12. The Trustees of East Boldre Village Hall:

- a. do not recommend in particular the use of any websites or other internet services and your use of the Service is carried out entirely at your own risk;
- b. have no responsibility for, or control over, the internet services you access and do not guarantee that any services are error or virus free;
- c. have no responsibility for, or control over, the information you transmit or receive via the Service;

- d. do not guarantee the availability of the Service; the speed at which information may be transmitted or received via the Service; or that the Service will be compatible with your equipment or any software which you use;
- e. do not guarantee the security of the information which you may transmit or receive using the Service or located on any equipment utilising the Service and you accept that it is your responsibility to protect your information and have adequate security (in terms of equipment and procedures) to ensure the security, integrity and confidentiality of your information and data;
- f. reserve the right at all times to withdraw the Service, change the specifications or manner of use of the Service, to change login information and passwords or other security information necessary to access the Service.
